LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Leviticus 13:1-2. 44-46

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons. 'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean." As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart: he must live outside the camp.'

'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. GREEK / HEBREW WORD

בָּרוּךְ הַגַּבֵר אֲשֵׁר יִבְשַׁת בַּיהוָה וִהָיָה יִהוָה מִבְשַׁתוֹ

Blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD, whose trust is the LORD. (Jeremiah 17:7)

Betach (בַּטַח) and Bittachon (בַּטַח) express a sense of well-being and security that results from placing confident expectation in God. The ancient Greek translation of the Torah (i.e., the Septuagint) never translates words deriving from this root in terms of merely "believing in God" (i.e., intellectual assent), but in terms of hoping or relying upon God's emunah (faithfulness) as the only true Source of hope. As the Psalms repeatedly state, the confidence that comes from relying upon God is valid only because of God's chesed (his loyalty or covenantal faithfulness). Some of the Jewish sages have said that bittachon can be of two forms: "active" bittachon and "passive" bittachon. Active bitachon is self-confidence to carry out actions and goals we set for ourselves. However, it is by God's grace that we are enabled to do anything at all, and this recognition leads to passive bitachon, namely, the confidence that God will work all things together for good to those who are trusting in Him (Rom. 8:28).

בְּטַת אֶל־יְהוָה בְּכָל־לִבֶּךְ

Trust in the LORD with all your heart (Proverbs 3:5)

בְּטַת בַּיהוָה וַעֲטֵׂה־טוֹב

Trust in the LORD and do good (Psalm 37:3)

Notice that this pasuk implies that when we trust in the LORD, we are more likely to do good in our world. So, have trust, bring more good into your life and be nourished.
