FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow. 'Listen, Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

SECOND READING: Hebrews 7:23-28

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to

God through him. To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens. one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION John 14:23

Alléluia, alléluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my father will love them, and we will come to them. **Alléluia !**

GOSPEL: Mark 12:28-34

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him anymore.

GREEK / HEBREW WORD

Greek: ἀκούω- akouo- listen

Hebrew: שמע - shema- listen

The Shema is the most important commandment for the people of Israel. It lies at the heart of the Jewish faith. However, it does not only mean listen but also obey. The prophets are always calling the people to listen. Listening and obeying to Christ produces fruits of eternal life. This means that when one listens and obeys to the word of God, the result is their capacity to love their neighbour.

At the heart of this Sunday's Gospel passage (cf. Mk 12:28b-34), there is the commandment of love: love of God and love of neighbour. A scribe asks Jesus: "Which commandment is the first of all?" (v. 28). He responds by quoting the profession of faith with which every Israelite opens and closes his day and begins with the words "Hear O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord" (Deut 6:4). In this manner Israel safeguards its faith in the fundamental reality of its whole creed: only one Lord exists, and that Lord is 'ours' in the sense that he is bound to us by an indissoluble pact; he loved us, loves us, and will love us for ever. It is from this source, this love of God, that the twofold commandment comes to us: "you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.... You shall love your neighbour as yourself" (Mk 12:30-31).

In choosing these two Words addressed by God to his people and by putting them together, Jesus taught once and for all that love for God and love for neighbour are inseparable; moreover, they sustain one another. Even if set in a sequence, they are two sides of a single coin: experienced together they are a believer's strength! To love God is to live of him and for him, for what he is and for what he does. Our God is unmitigated giving; he is unlimited forgiveness; he is a relationship that promotes and fosters. Therefore, to love God means to invest our energies each day to be his assistants in the unmitigated service of our neighbour, in trying to forgive without limitations, and in cultivating relationships of communion and fraternity.

SECONDA LETTURA

Eb 7,23-28

Fratelli, [nella prima alleanza] in gran numero sono diventati sacerdoti, perché la morte impediva loro di durare a lungo. Cristo invece, poiché resta per sempre, possiede un sacerdozio che non tramonta. Perciò può salvare perfettamente quelli che per mezzo di lui si avvicinano a Dio: egli infatti è sempre vivo per intercedere a loro favore. Questo era

il sommo sacerdote che ci occorreva: santo, innocente, senza macchia, separato dai peccatori ed elevato sopra i cieli. Egli non ha bisogno, come i sommi sacerdoti, di offrire sacrifici ogni giorno, prima per i propri peccati e poi per quelli del popolo: lo ha fatto una volta per tutte, offrendo se stesso. Il Signore nostro Dio è l'unico Signore; amerai il Signore tuo Dio con tutto il tuo cuore e con tutta la tua anima, con tutta la tua mente e con tutta la tua forza".
